


ScienceDirect Records and Endnote

To import records from ScienceDirect into Endnote, a search must be completed. After the desired results have been obtained follow these steps:

1. Mark the desired records by checking the beside its citation. After all records for export have been marked, click the “Export Citations” button.

2. The Export Citations console should be displayed on your computer. Select a desired content Format, select “RIS format (for Reference Manager, ProCite, EndNote),” and click the “Export” button. This will launch your Endnote program. You should then select the Endnote library to which you want to save the citations and the citations will be imported into your Endnote library.
