

Have you ever thought that a book you requested through ILL would make a good addition to our library collection? Now USC faculty who ask to borrow a book or other item from another institution through Interlibrary Loan (ILL) have the option to request that the item be purchased and added to the Libraries' collection. Are you getting the most out of "My Account"?



All faculty members have access to the library through "My Account". "My Account" allows you to:

- 1) view and renew checked out materials
- 2) save "preferred searches" in the catalog and receive alerts when new materials are added that match your search
- 3) keep a record of the materials you have borrowed (optional).
