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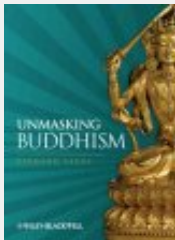
I have enjoyed taking the recent Religious Studies faculty candidates around the library and seeing some of your faces.

All faculty members have access to the library through "My Account". "My Account" allows you to:

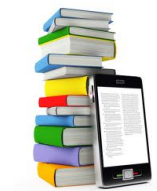
- 1) view and renew checked out materials
