I've had the opportunity to work with some new classes along with requests from some I regularly meet. Keep those requests for library sessions and online guides coming my way!

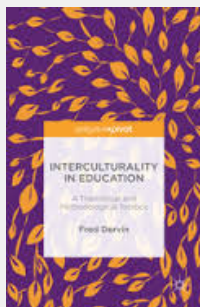
It's been great to receive purchase requests for films and books. Keep those coming too!

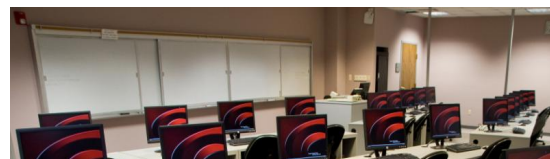
