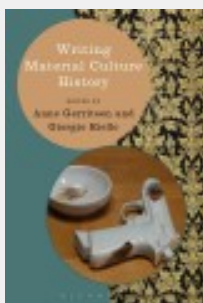

Institutional Repository

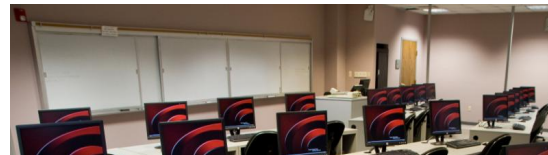
