Remember that the TCL librarians are available to work with you on creating library assignments that expose the students to the many resources we have. We can also do [instructional classes](#) tailored to your needs.

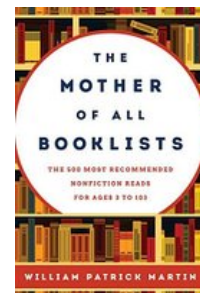

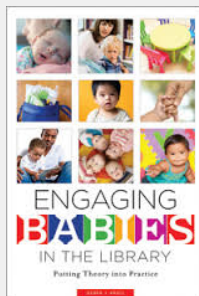
Mother of All Booklists

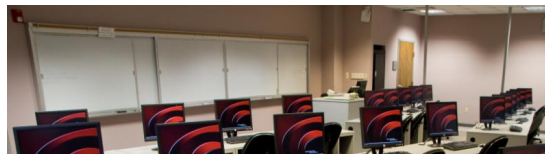
