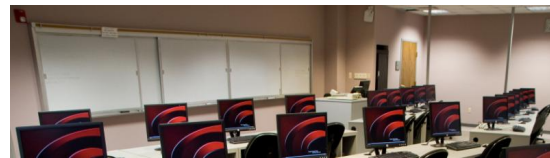
Remember When?
